What genres are popular? Why? Comedy is a popular genre in the Noscars as I beleive they	
are some of the most enjoyable for the audience. Comedies are also less dependant upon perfect acting and camera technique, but more on the comedy of the director that can	
be successfully done well. A lot of comedy films make use of	
staff members or well known students to add to the comedy	
 of the film, something unique to the Noscars audience that would not be found funny outside of the Newlands audience. Horror films such as Nightlight and Sizzle are famous in terms of audience reaction at the Noscars as they involve everyone and incite a reaction from the audience, making them all round enjoyable. Why might it be important to use a recognisable genre as a framework for your film? Using a recogniseable genre for the framework of the film is helpful in terms of understanding audience expectations for the film, but also as a base from which to work from. Each genre has its own tropes and conventions which can be used or subverted to fulfill the audiences expectations. 	

Pick a particular genre. What might be some of the pluses and minuses of attempting that genre? Comedy as a genre is very subjective, with audience members all having different senses of humour, so the success of the film would be very dependant upon the script itself. Being so dependant on the script, comedies tend to leave some wriggle room in terms of acting quality and film techniques as the audience is more focused on wether the film is funny or not.

What are some conclusions that can be made from the list of films that resonated with the audience?

Films that resonated with the audience are those which encited a reaction from the audience, wehter they were scared with Nightlight, happy because of Its About the Journey, or sad after I Found you. The Noscar's audience want to feel something from the films they see, and be able to connect with what they are watching as the Noscars audience works in collaboration with the directors in terms of the films reception.
